Police Report

Two incidents were reported in the parish in the last 30 days; a suspect vehicle and a missing fuel cap leading to suspicion of fuel siphoning.

Following discussion at the August meeting, parishioners are encouraged by our PCSO to use the **101 phone number** to report any issues such as nuisance motorbikes, suspect vehicles or vandalism.

Traffic Calming Update

Our PCSO has been working with us to conduct spot checks on the main roads within the parish.

We reported to him the likely roads in and out of the villages that were likely to have speeding traffic and these spot checks have been conducted over the last 8 weeks.



Although this was effective in the short term, it would be beneficial to hear if you believe any regular days of the week, or times during the day that we can support the police further with more information.


